

EX-JUDGE G. D. W. VROOM.

**Former Member of New Jersey
Court of Errors and Appeals Dies.**

TRENTON, N. J., March 4.—Garret Dorset Wall Vroom, former Judge of the Court of Errors and Appeals, and one of the best-known lawyers and bankers in this part of the country, died at his home in this city this evening, from a complication of diseases.

Ex-Judge Vroom was born in this city Sept. 17, 1843, and had lived here all his life. He had been prominently mentioned several times as a candidate for the nomination for Governor of the State. He was admitted to the bar in 1865, and became a member of the Court of Errors and Appeals in 1901, after he had served as City Solicitor, Prosecutor of Mercer County and Mayor of Trenton, and had held other important positions.

He was a famous collector of books and a grower of roses. He was President of the Trenton Savings Fund Society and head of the law firm of Vroom, Dickinson & Scammel.
