

## THE HINELINE LINE

1. MATHIAS HEINLEIN (1)-progenitor of the Heinlein family in America, took passage in the ship "Bannister", Captain John Boyle, from Amsterdam (6). Arrived in Philadelphia on October 31, 1754 with his wife Sarah, son George, and daughters Eva and Sarah. He became a naturalized citizen September 6, 1761. Why Mathias chose to leave home in the Palatinate region of Germany remains a mystery but one could speculate that he, along with many of his countrymen at the time, were immigrants for conscience' sake. They fled from home and country for sake of their religion. Many of them are said to have been pious, and though not able to bring their ministers, brought with them their catechisms, hymn books and other devotional books. Settling in the "Forks of the Delaware" (Durham Township, Buck County, Pennsylvania), Matthias and family were among a population of 250 German immigrants.(1) The name Heinlein, anglicizes to Himeline, means "a grove on the plain".

2. George (2) Heinlein b 1742 Germany; d 1805 Pennsylvania; a son of Mathias Heinlein and Sarah ( ) Heinlein was a very popular man and became captain of the Durham Township Militia, having served all through the Revolutionary War (2). George Heinlein and Henry Hautt were signers of the letter for partitioning of the Durham Iron Company tract of land dated 1773. He purchased his first tract of land (90 acres) in 1774 from the Durham Iron Company for purpose of farming. Over the next several years he purchased an additional 150 acres extending his holdings into Williams Township, Northampton County bordering on the Delaware River. Captain Heinlein died October 2, 1805.(3) The records of the First Reformed Church of Easton, Pennsylvania list his name among the first settlers of the Forkes of the Delaware. His remains lie buried in his private burial ground on the south side of Butcher Hill along Hellertown Road, about one half mile west of Delaware River Road (1). It was mentioned at a family reunion held circa 1920 that his tombstone was in the possession of Forrest Edelmann, Hatboro, Pennsylvania. On October 2, 1763 he married Sarah Dukson b 1745; d abt. 1809, daughter of John Dukson and Eleanora \_\_\_\_\_, (4) by whom he had 11 children.

Last Will & Testament of George Heinlein (5)

“To my wife Sarah, five acres of the land purchased from Jacob Bucher, balance of land to be sold, notice to be given in Easton, English and Germantown papers. Proceeds to daughter MARGARET, wife of Nicholas Brotzman one thirteenth part; to daughter ELEANOR, wife of John Bucher one thirteenth part, to son LAWRENCE one thirteenth part, to daughter SARAH, wife of Abram Bucher one thirteenth part, to son JAMES one thirteenth part, to son George one thirteenth part, to daughter CATHERINE one thirteenth part, to son WILLIAM one thirteenth part, to son READING one thirteenth part, to daughter ANN one thirteenth part, to son JOHN one thirteenth part. To my wife SARAH two thirteenth parts to keep son JOHN as long as she lives.” Witnesses: John Boyar and Margill Starn

\*Elizabeth was the daughter of Jacob & Anna Bell, Orthodox Quakers who frowned upon the attention given their daughter by a young grocer clerk, Hugh Bay, son of Rev. Andrew Bay, a chaplain in the Provincial Army. When Hugh Bay became a soldier in the Revolutionary War, he was refused admittance to the Bell household. In defiance to her parents' wishes, Elizabeth answered the call for all citizens to gather lead to make bullets for the war effort by removing the weights from her father's clock and giving them to Hugh. This caused such a fury in the Quaker community that Elizabeth was sent to Europe to finish her education. After four years she returned home, and much to her parents' chagrin, married Hugh Bay at Old Swedes Church, Philadelphia on 16 Aug 1781. They had only one child (Ann) before Hugh died after three years of marriage. On 2 Sep 1790 she became the wife of Dr. Abel Morgan, a prominent physician in Philadelphia and formerly a surgeon in the Revolutionary Army. Elizabeth died 16 Oct 1839 at the age of 80 and was buried in the Ref. Cemetery, now the site of the Easton Free Library. The infamous clock is now in the possession of Charles E. Hineline.

Mr. Hine entered the newspaper field on the "German Democrat" of Easton, Pennsylvania in 1829, subsequently going to the "Inquirer" under Jesper Harding before becoming the publisher of the Camden Democrat, a neatly printed, carefully edited four-page paper of twenty-eight column folio, first published 3 Jan 1846. The offices of the Democrat were located on the southeast corner of 2nd and Federal Streets, Camden, N.J. Mr. Hine continued as publisher of the Democrat until 1853, when he disposed of his interest to Colonel Isaac Mickle. This was Mr. Hine's second newspaper venture in Camden. In 1840, he purchased of Messrs. Harrison and Ferguson a paper called the "Tribune" later known however as the "Two Thousand Gratis" which assured advertisers that the circulation reached that figure, and to make it true, gave the paper away. Mr. Hine's associate at this time was Henry Curts, who operated a small printery in Camden and was instrumental in changing the name of the paper to the "American Eagle." Mr. Hine soon disposed of his interests, selling to a Mr. Bossee, and moved to Indiana where he began publishing the New Albany "Ledger." Not satisfied with the west, he returned to Camden in 1845 and a year later he established the Camden Democrat as a new enterprise. Mr. Hine was a man of ability. Both handsome and able, he managed to take the Democrat to the front ranks of newspapers of the day, and began a career of influence and usefulness which, if not always profitable to its owners, had at least been honorable and helpful in the furtherance of important reforms and measures that were beneficial to the people. Mr. Hine was a democrat of Democrats, but his party zeal never blinded him to the welfare of the working people. He worked unselfishly and untiringly during his entire journalistic career. Nowhere was there a more faithful and efficient defender than the Camden Democrat whose editor was elected and reelected to the New Jersey Assembly in 1851 and 1852.

Through his efforts, the ten hour bill was passed, the abolition of the property qualification required of a chosen Freeholder, of Jurors, and other officials was urged, and the \$200.00 exemption was advocated. In the Spring of 1852, while still a member of the Assembly, Mr. Hine was elected mayor of Camden, defeating a 5 time incumbent, Dr. Fisler.

Ever restless, upon selling the Camden Democrat in 1853, Mr. Hine returned to Northampton, Pennsylvania, where he assayed store keeping for a short period, with little success, then went to Phillipsburg, N.J. where he started "The Standard." He returned to Camden in 1855 and started a paper called the "Spirit of 76," which was later merged with the "Democrat." Under President Buchanan, Hine held a position in the Philadelphia Custom House. He later started a labor paper, "The National Mechanic" in Philadelphia, his associates being William Van Northwick and Henry L. Bonsall (afterwards founder of the "New Republic" and "Camden Daily Post.") His next move was the "Pennsylvania State Sentinel" of Harrisburg,

where he came into friendly relations with Governor Packer, who rewarded his party loyalty with an appointment as Superintendent of Public Printing. He later came back to Camden, but his ambition to found further newspapers was gone, and he devoted his time to reportorial work for several years until his death.(6) He still remained a patriot, however, and on April 16, 1861, just three days after the Confederates fired upon Ft. Sumter, Mr. Hineline joined an enthusiastic group of loyal citizens in signing a proclamation to the President of the United States, expressing outrage at the recent course of events declaring "unalterable determination to sustain the government in its efforts to maintain the honor, integrity and existence of our National Union and the perpetuity of the popular government, and to redress the wrongs and defend the Flag of our Country." Mr. Hineline lies buried in the Palmer Street Graveyard in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It is with this generation that the name Heinlein was changed to Hineline. pursued a journalistic career. On 28 Sept. 1863, he married Elizabeth Augusta Pechman, b. 12 August 1843, d. 1872\* in Camden, N.J. buried in Evergreen Cemetery and in 1930 moved to Harleigh Cemetery, daughter of Frederick and Marie Pechmann. \*Because of the early death of Elizabeth Pechman, the children, Frank Judson (6) Hine was raised by his maternal grandparents, Frederick and Marie Pechmann, and Carrie May (6) Hine was adopted by a family named Snythe in Philadelphia, friends of her parents. 62... Frank Judson (6) HineLine b. 15 Mar 1867 in Washington DC; d 29 Apr 1933 at 316 Chews Landing Road, Haddonfield, NJ; bur. 2 May 1933 at Harleigh Cemetery, . Camden, N.J. Frank Judson HineLine attended the Liberty School at Eighth and Spruce Streets, Camden, N.J. and, in June 1882, was the first newsboy of the Camden Courier newspaper. At ten years of age entered the employ of MacCullugh, Smith and Jordan, type founders. Later he went to Camden Iron Works, where he became assistant foreman. In December 1894, Frank J. HineLine, Isaac Walter Budd, Hiram Epright Budd and Edward B. Stone organized the Camden Lime Company, Camden, NJ, distributors of mason builders' materials. Frank HineLine was the junior member of the firm. The company did not prosper in the first few years of its existence, and the older

members resigned leaving the company in Frank Hinline's hands. He made the company grow and in 1925 moved to larger quarters. It was by then the largest distributor of mason builders' materials New Jersey, its sales running well over a million dollars annually. His son, Frank Budd Hinline assisted in the growth of the company and was secretary and treasurer. In the late 1920s, the Camden Lime Company had yards at 1433 Pine Street, Walnut and Pine Streets, and Federal Street at Cooper River. The office was at 39 S. 6th Street. Mr. Hinline was a director of Camden Safe Deposit and Trust Co., a charter member of the Camden Club, a member of the Camden Lodge of Elks, honorary president of James Audubon Chapter of the Isaac Walton League, member of Camden Gun Club, a 33 degree Mason and member of a number of Masonic organizations. During the war, Mr. Hinline became a "Dollar-a-Year Man," and worked on the War Labor Board. He also was on the Camden County Staff of Lecturers in connection with the Draft Board, and spoke each week to departing soldiers. He was identified with the best target shooters in the country and earned many trophies and awards for shooting. This family lived first in Camden, NJ, later moving to Collingswood, and finally, in the 1920s, to Haddonfield, N.J. On 27 Apr 1892 at the Chews Landing Methodist Church, mar. Alberta (Albertha) Budd b. 8 Aug 1871 in Camden, NJ; d. 5 Jan 1958 while living at 121 Warwick Road, Haddonfield, N.J., bur. 8 Jan 1958 in Lot 3, Grave 9, Harleigh Cemetery., Camden, NJ, a dau. of Isaac Walter and Jennie Vanaman (Scudder) Budd.
