BRIDGE REPORT TODAY

Members of New Jersey Commission to Discuss Plans—Will Consider Terminal Locations

Members of the New Jersey Bridge and Tunnel Commission will meet today to hear the report of the Committee on Sites and Location, which recently held a conference with the Pennsylvania Commission in regard to the project of connecting Camden and Philadelphia by either an under or over water route or both.

It is the desire of the Jersey men to work in harmony, so far as the plans are concerned, with the commission on the Philadelphia side of the river. This is especially so with respect to the location of the terminals.

It is the desire to have one of the terminals in Camden, between the territory bounded by Cooper and Kaighn avenue. It is also hoped to have plans under way in order that work along tangible lines may be done this summer.

One May Die as Result of Race Fight

A fight yesterday between Russians and Lithuanians at Fourth and Emerald streets, Camden, resulted in a number of broken heads and other injuries to the combatants. One of them was so seriously injured that it is feared at Cooper Hospital he may not recover. He is John Duzik, 33 years old, of 1877 South Fourth street, whose skull was fractured. Anthony Sanduski, 36 years old, of 1830 South Fourth street, is alleged to have hurled a brick which struck the injured man. Sanduski was held without bail by Recorder Stackhouse to await the result of Duzik's injuries.
