KILLED BY BULLET Sent through fence

Camden Man Was Shot With Rifle —by Professed Friend Who Soon Gave Himself Up to the Police

John P. Krippe, 38 years old, of 1829 South Seventh street, Canden, was shot and killed by Definis Whalen, of 669 Central avenue, yesterday atternoon. A bullet from a nfle struck Kripps over the heart, and be died while being taken to the Cooper Hospital. Although the shooting was declared to be accidental, Whalen disappeared in the excitement, but he surrendered himself last night. The dead man leaves a widow and two children.

Employed by Archibald Bahnew, a huckker, Kripps was in Bahnew's yard, in the rear of 1733 Van Buren street, when there was a report of a rife. Kripps straightened, placed his hand over his heart and then fell to the ground. He was meconscious when pick-beide hum and holdmg his hand, the wounded man passed away while the auto ambulance was speeding to the hospital. An added touching resure, will be fact that Kripps' broicher, Willam, a result of an accident when the hody was carried in on a stretcher.

Although a dozen police and detectives were on the scene within a few moments. Whalen could not be found. From the investigation it was shown that Whalen and some frands had been pracing from the fence that separated the yard from labnew's. It was not thought that the weapon had sufficient force to send the leaden missiles through the heavy loast fence. An examination shorheavy hoard fence. Whalen was overcome when he surrendered. He thought he had only wounded Kripps, whom, he declared, was a close friend of his.
