

MAIL SWINDLER MUST FACE FORGERY CHARGE

After serving two years in the Eastern Penitentiary for the misuse of the mails, Marshal Ney Mikles, alias W. C. Raymond, alias C. E. Allen, has been arrested by Detective Cherry, of the Camden Prosecutor's office, on an indictment for forgery returned in December, 1909. Mikles was held at Moyamensing Prison pending requisition papers.

Frank H. Dunham, of Richmond, Ind., purchased from a supposed reputable Philadelphia firm some land in Texas. When he came to have the deed executed he found that Mikles was the company and that he not only did not own the land but had sold his fictitious holdings no less than six times. As a result the United States authorities caused his arrest and subsequent imprisonment. The Camden authorities allege that Mikles executed a deed in Camden and forged names to the instrument, and it is for this alleged illegal act they want him for trial.
