CAMDEN SEVERE WITH SPEEDING AUTOISTS

Several Are Arrested After Falling Into Police Trap Set at the Ferry

Continuing their crusade against automobilists who violate the law, Camden's police and State Inspectors Pedigree and Campbell yesterday arrested several for breaking the speed law. Stationed at Elm, where they have their "traps," they saw two machines pass. They went so fast that all they could get was a meagre description of them. This was phoned to the Camden police and every ferry was covered.

It was 1.20 when Policeman Garrison and Motorcycle Policeman Pedigree received word to look out for the speed fiends at the Federal street ferry and at 7.50 the two machines hove in sight. They had gone the thirty miles in that time. Sent to the City Hall they gave the names of Herman Pressman, of 1650 Broadway, New York, and James A. Callahan, of 250 North Twenty-first street, Philadelphia. They put up \$55 security for hearings before Recorder Stackhouse today. The only excuse they gave was that they wanted to "get the air."

For speeding along Third street, Robert Young, a negro, of 700 South Eighth street, was arrested by Policeman Steelman and fined \$10.

This same officer arrested Samuel Camarato, of 425 North Eighth street, Philadelphia, for persisting in running his auto between a trolley car on which passengers were trying to board and the curb. This arrest was made because of many complaints being received. On the way to jail Camarato tried to bribe the officer to get away, so Steelman asserted. Recorder Stackhouse imposed a fine of \$10.
