Testifies Jealous Attack by Spurned Suitor Preceded Villano Killing

Margaret Hastings, 23-year-old divorcee and former caharet sloget, took the witness stand yesterday before Judge Barnett in Quarice Sessions Conrt and described in a low, scarcely mulble tone the events which led'up to the killing, in her room at 1025 Walaut street, of John Villano, frui's tand vendor, whose fealoury for her affection cost hip bis life last January.

After a trial lating only one day the jury arrived in eight minutes at a verdict acquiting 20-year-old Frank M. Doris, known as "Tenderloin Frankie," of the sizing of Villano.
