OBITUARY -Yesterday morning about half past six o'clock, Dr Thomas F. Cullen, who had been lying dangerously ill for some time past, ended his useful career, in death, at the age of fifty six years. Decrased made Camden his place of residence; in 1549, when the cholera prevailed to an atarming and fatal extent, he was very successful, although young, in the treatment of that terrible disease. He was a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, and from the time he commenced the practice of his profession to the day he was prostrated with sickness he sedulously applied himself to the studies and duties of a physician. He was author of a number of medical essays, and hal the horor of being a leading member and Presi dent of the State, County and City Modical Sycirties. His death will be seriously felt by the medical faculty and the community at large.
