Charles Ford to Meet Death in Electric Chair Week Beginning November 24

Charles Ford, who shot and Palled Mrs. Mary Effic Wagner, at [Line]. Springs on March 14 last, must divisite his crime in the electric chair's at <u>Tra-</u> ton during the week of November 24, that sentence being passed upon him yesterday by Supreme Court Justice Garrison in Camden after a verifict of guilty of murder in the first destree was submitted. The jury deliverated exactly one hour. When the verifict was conounced and the sentence imposed Foul did not give any indication that he card. He appared to be deared.

For eighten years Ford had lived with the woman and during that time she had left him fourteen times because of his abure. On the last occasion she sought to escape him by going to Laurel Springs, Ford claimups he had gone with Robert Wilson. In vengeful mood and, the State alleged, after planning and debberating, he visited her home, shot Wilson, dangerously wounding him, killed the woman and then sent two bullets into his own head.

Lavgrees Frank B. Jess and Adam H. Soan, who were assigned to defend him, sought to have him except on a second degree verticit, they declaring that because of his excessive drinking his mind was not such as could plan a crime of that character.
