BREEDING A PESTILENCE.

Colored People Baried Too Near the Surface at Camden, N. J.

CAMDEN, N. J., March 28 .- The special committee of the Camden Board of Health anpointed to investigate the condition of Butter's barial ground for colored people, in the rear of the Evergreen Cemetery, have made an official investigation, assisted by several city officials. The inquiry developed the fact that the State sanstary and burial laws had been grossly violated, and that serious results might follow during the coming hot weather, and an epidemic of deathdealing disease mucht result from the surface interments. Thirty-five tests were made as to what depth bodies had been interred. The iron struck coffins eighteen inches below the surface. and in several cases the bodies were only one foot deep. It was also said by the commission that when they dug up several graves bones were turned up and the feet of persons were plainly visible. Altogether, it is said, few bodies are buried as deep as three feet, and the stench of the decomposing ficsh makes the place a nuisance and breeds disease. Dempsoy Butler, the owner of the ground as said to be worth \$60,000 and is a magnate among the colored people. He said to-night; "I know nothing about ghastly rumors of doge going into the graveyard and caung human hones; dogs might have been seen there, but no complaint has been made, to my gnowledge Bodies have been buried without my knowledge and without nermits, but what they were I can not say." The Inspector of the Board of Health says that no permits of burial have been granted for this cometery for a month, yet it is claumed there have been buriats in the interval. Probably State prosecution will swait action of the board of free holders.
