## BY HIS VICTIM'S BEDSIDE.

A Dying Man Identifies Andrew Eckert as His Murderer.

Camben is likely to have three nurder trials at the next term of fourt. The third and last victim is Thomas McDowogh, of Eighth and Mountain strets, this city, who was stabled at Beidenna's station, which is on the outskirts of Camden, on Monday verning last. The man who is accessed it having done the cutting is Andrew Eckert, of Port Richmond. About 8 o'clock last inght word was receired

Judge Hugg intormed the Sheriff that as the prisoner was in the custody of the Camden county authorities he would take him to Philadelphia.

Acting under the judge's instructions the Sheriff procured a cab, and with Mayor Pratt, Policeman Cable, of the Canden police force, and Magistrate Kerswell, drove to the County Jail.

The prisoner was then handcuiled and driven on board a ferryboat. After crossing the river the cab drove to the Central Station. There the officers and prisoner disembarked and the accused man was taken before Chief of Detecives Wood.

Detective Hulfish was detailed to assist the Camden officers. The officers and prisoner then went to the Pennsylvania Hospital.

They were met at the hospital by Magistrate Eisenbrown. They then proceeded to the bedside of the dying man, when the latter made the following dying declaration.

Thomas Nelloaough, who being sworn according to law, doth depose and say that on or about August 5, 1889, at Beldeman's station. State of New Jersoy, deponent was cut and stabbed in the abdomen with a knife or sharp instrument by one Andrew Eckert, and deponent verily 'belleves he will die from the effect of stald cut yor stabs.

Magistrate Eisenbrown swore him to this statement and he made bismark over his signatore. The witness to the statement was Detective Hulfah. The dying man's wife and his sister were at his bediate most of the night. The prisoner never spoke a word throughout his journey.
