## RESCUE 5 PERSONS At camden fire

Paralyzed Woman and Three Children Carried, From Burning Apartment House

Captain of Engine Company Overcome by Smoke Found Unconscious in Hall

Fire persons, an unconscious fire captain, a paralyzed woman and three little children, were carried to safety shortly before 9 o'clock yresterday morning when fire gutted the third floor of the apartment house at 417 Vine street.

David Baird Robinson, an assistant deputy surrogate, braved the flames and smoke to carry the sick woman and children to the street.

children to the street. Mr. Robinson lives on Larch street directly back of the Vine street apartment. Sceing smoke pouring from the third floor apartment occupied by the Lamily of Winston Prekel, he hurried Mrs. Anny Mosler, 72 years old, was lepices in her bei from paralysis. Making his way to her room Ikobinsonrartied Mrs. Mosley down the smokefilled stairs. Iteturning to the third floor, he found three little children in the apartment of William Carcy, sleeping in one bed. Placing them in a blanket he carried them down stairs, and gave them in care of meighbors.

Leading his men up on the stairs with a line of hose, Captain Rollo Jones, of No. 6 Engine Company, was overcome by smoke on the second floor. Fellow firemen stambled over his unconscious form and he was carried to the street by Captain William Mertz, of No. 1 Engine Company. Captain Jones and Mrs. Moley time Jones was in a serious condition. but was finally revived through the ilberal use of oxygen. Jones was overcome in spite of the fact that he was wearing a gmoke mask.

The increase caused by an over-heated bat plate and gutted the third door of 417 and badly damaged the top floor of the house at 415. Housebold effects owned by William E. Curtis, F. C. crane, B. E. Laue and William Careg, occupants of their apartments, were damaged by smoke and water. The apartments are owned by J. W. Young and the loss is placed at \$3000.
