## EIGHTY-ONE CONVICTS OUT OF STATE PRISON

Many Prisoners Paroled, Among Them John Priestly, Sent Up From Camden for Arson

J., Dec. 28.-Eighty-one inmates of the New Jersey State Prison, including several murderers, got belated Christmas presents today in the shape of paroles, that body acting along lines recommended by Governor Fort, whose object is to prevent prison-overcrowding as far as possible by the releas-ing of prisoners who have served more than half of their time and are accredited with good behavior.
