GOV. WERTS MAKES APPOINTMENTS.

Some of Them Confirmed by the Sepate and Some Rejected.

TRENTON, N. J., May 17.-Gov. Werts appointed the following as the commission of twenty to suggest amendments to the Constitution for the revision of the judicial system of the State:

At Large-John P. Stockton, Allan McDermott, William Walter Phelps, Samuel H. Grey; First District--Howard Carrow, George Hires; Second District--William M. Lanning. Hobart, Probst; Sixth District-Frederick Fre-John D. linghuysen, Edward Halbach, Jr.: Seventh Dis-trict-Joseph D. Bedle, Col. E. A. Stevens; Eighth District-- John Kean, Jr., J. M. C. Morrow.

The Governor nominated William A. New-ell for lay Judge of Salem County, William T. Hoffman of Monmouth for Circuit Judge in place of Senator Voorhees, (declined,) and John I. Holt of Passaic (Speaker of the House) as Riparian Commissioner in place of R. B. Reading, (withdrawn.)

Senator Voorhees's declination of the Circuit Judgeship was made upon the ground that, having been elected to the Senate, he owed it to his constituents to serve out his term.

The Senate this afternoon confirmed the appointments for the Constitution Com-mission and the Riparian Commissioner. Major E. J. Anderson, the nominee for State Prison Supervisor was confirmed by a vote of 18 to 2. Senator Skirm (Rep., Mercer,) and Senator Drake (Dem., Morris,) for confirmed voted against him. The nominations of Wilson S. Jenkins for Prosecutor of Cam-den County and John Gaunt for lay Judge of Camden County were rejected. Action on other nominations was as fol-
