THENTON, N. J., Dee, 18—The case of Paul Woodward, the condemned Camden murderer, is to be considered by the Court of Pardons. This was promised to day by Governor Murphy to Lawyer Fred A. Rex. Governor Murphy ary at the case has not been reached when the court adjourns, Boeenber 21, he will grant Woodward a reprieve until some action is taken.

Mr. Rev's ground for appeal is that there was some intermarrying of relatives in Woodward's family which might justify a degree of insanity that would warrant the commutation of the condemned man's sentence.

In the jail at Camden Woodward continues to anuse humself with his gramophone. He is sangune of getting his death sentence commuted. He cats and sleeps regularly and apparently does not worry in the least.
